

ARTS INITIATIVE BRINGS OUT THE shutterbug in employees

Remember bringing your parents to your classroom and proudly pointing to the picture you created? Clarian Health and Indiana University employees are reliving that experience through *Photos for Health*.

This unique art initiative was devised by Jacqueline Buckingham Anderson LLC, an Indianapolis art and design firm. “The goal of the project has been to empower the thousands of people affiliated with Clarian to contribute creatively to an enterprise dedicated to family-based health and wellness,” Buckingham Anderson explains.

Clarian Arnett’s photography collection emphasizes “Trees, Their Inhabitants and Environments,” reflecting the symbolic and medicinal meaning of trees. At Indiana University Melvin and Bren Simon Cancer Center, the unifying theme is “Images of Nature that Evoke Peace, Healing and Serenity.” The Riley Hospital for Children project focuses on “Animals and Ecosystems,” such as images of wildlife and ecosystems, including oceans, rainforests and mountains.

Fairbanks Hall, Indiana University/Clarian Education and Resource Center will feature a video media wall that will display a selection of the submitted images, words and phrases akin to the mission of Clarian.

More than 5,500 photographs have been submitted to provide peaceful, healing environments. ●
